In Nepal the government guarantees education for all. Education is highly valued. Most poor children stay in primary school.

However economic pressures mean that the poorer children drift away from school before they reach secondary school.

Their parents need them to work in the fields, or earn shortterm work as porters. Some drift to the capital Kathmandu and work in unskilled occupations.

There is evidence that children who stay in school after 10 have less children and are more likely to become professional people. Children staying in school to 16 and beyond will have happier, more fulfilled lives and help to the improvement of the economy.

Economic pressures to leave












Where your support will go: for each college student
